Open Court Reading: Unit 9 Lesson 3 Day I
Objectives: Students will: review $/ \bar{a} /$ and $|a|$, blend and read words that contain $/ \bar{a} /$ and $|a|$, review the elements of narrative nonfiction, read and discuss "America is...", review and use the Clarifying and Visualizing comprehension strategies, develop their understanding of vocabulary words, focus on reading with prosody, and identify and use future-tense verbs.

1. Please have your child blend and read the following words:

| fat | black | badge | wax |

| safe | snakes | days | space |
| pain | rain | strain | trait |
| pan | pane | tap | tape |

2. Have them read these sentences:

- Jan and Jake played in the rain.
- Kate plans to take the train to visit Gram.

3. Do activities on your Day I Dashboard for today (make sure to change it to Lesson 3 Day D: review long a and short a by listening to the cards and read over the Home Connection.
4. Review the vocabulary words for the story: nation, freedom, miners, skyscrapers, glimmer, vast, tribes, horizon
5. Review the elements of narrative nonfiction- it is about real people or places and uses descriptive language and imagery to create a story with facts.
6. Listen to or read "America is..." and then go over the Know/Want to Know/Learned chart. Clarify text for your child as they read and help them to visualize the descriptive text.
7. Review future-tense verbs. Give your child a verb and have them use it in the future.
8. Read an AR book and take a test.

Essential Question: What does America mean to you?

Spelling: Have your child copy the spelling words down on lined paper.

Writing: Students are going to write a description of a place they like using sensory details like those the author used in the story "A Trip to Peru." Parents model how to get ideas for a place to describe. There are so many places that I Ike, I'm not sure which one to write about. IIll start by making a list of places and then think about each one. List on a piece of paper three or four appropriate places with which your child is familiar, such as a local park, zoo, or swimming pool; a local landmark; or a sport's arena. Tell them to think about a place they would like to write a description of. Have your child fill out workbook pp. 157-158 found on Day 2.

Objective/Skill: Choose the more reasonable measuring tool to solve problems.
Activity: Display a hole punch and scissors. Model how you would decide what tool to use for a job. Do pp. $535-536$ in the classroom workbook.
