Mrs. Sokolik's First Grade Assignments Thursday, March 19th

Open Court Reading: Unit 9 Lesson 1 Day 4

Objectives: Students will: build fluency by reading **Decodable** 103, review and practice using selection vocabulary words, review the elements of poetry, read and discuss "This Land Is Your Land.", review and use the Clarifying and Visualizing comprehension strategies, identify the point of view and analyze the elements of poetry, answer questions about the Lesson I selections, read the Social Studies Connection

- I. Read Decodable Mr. Paws Invents.
- 2. Review verb tenses by writing one funny sentence in the past and one funny sentence in the present.
- 3. Do activities on your Day 4 Dashboard for today: e-activity, e-game, and worksheets 137-140.
- 4. Read This Is Your Land and discuss the fact that it's a poem and symbolism held within.
- 5. Read an AR book and take a test.

Spelling: Have your child play a game with their spelling words in <u>Spelling City</u>. You can also give your child a practice spelling test. For each missed word, have them do jumping jacks while spelling that word out loud (trying to think of something to get them up and moving :)). I am also going to attach a tic-tac-toe type activity where the students can pick an activity off of there to do.....some we already do.

Math- Chapter 17 Lesson 17.5

Obj./Skill: Compare and order the weights of objects using nonstandard units and direct comparison.

Activity: Display a balance scale (if you have one or a picture of one if you don't) and explain that you can use it to find how much an object weighs. Use an eraser and cube and compare the weight between the two. Discuss what each side does when you put those objects on it. Do pp. 511–512. Unfortunately our math curriculum does not have the ability to access it online, and there is not a hardback book for it either. Please make sure your child is completing at least two sessions of Reflex Math at home.

Writing: For the next two days please have your child write 5 sentences answering the question "Would you rather eat cake or ice cream? Why?" They need to have a topic sentence, three details, and a conclusion. Please edit, discuss, date and keep in a folder.

I know the students are excited about being able to take AR tests at home. I am excited for them! I encourage you to have your child test just as they would at school, without help from others or while looking at the book.
